In the beautiful Franconian wine country, wine lovers can enjoy the award-winning and fine wines.



DAY 1

Morning

Arrival at Munich Airport. Transfer to Nuremberg (2 h 30 m*)

WELCOME TO NUREMBERG!

The charming city of <u>Nuremberg</u> is over 950 years old and is famous not only for its historic highlights but also for its culinary traditions. For example, the Original Nuremberger Rostbratwurst is known far beyond the city's borders.

Check in to Le Méridien Grand Hotel Nürnberg

Since 1896, this grand hotel has blended historic charm with contemporary comfort, offering 190 elegantly designed rooms. Having hosted royalty, presidents, and celebrities – and even serving as the U.S. Army HQ –it remains a true Nuremberg landmark.

Afternoon

Food Walking Tour: From Bratwurst to Gingerbread with cookionista

A culinary tour of the historic center with anecdotes about Nuremberg's history while sampling traditional Franconian cuisine, such as sausages, beer and gingerbread.

Lebkuchen-Baker's de Luxe Workshop

Bake and decorate your own Elisen-Lebkuchen and take your self-baked Lebkuchen home.



Optional: Tour Red Beer in Deep Cellars

Beneath Nuremberg's old town is an extensive labyrinth, a 600-year-old rock-cut cellars, where the traditional Nuremberg Rotbier (red ale) used to mature.



Shop at Breuninger

Breuninger, an upscale German department store offers an exclusive selection of international designer brands. Personal shopping, bespoke tailoring services, its own confectionery dessert shop and cocktail bar provide visitors with a pleasant experience.

DAY 2

Morning

Transfer from Nuremberg to Franconian Wine Country, Randersacker (1 h 30 m*)

WELCOME TO FRANCONIAN WINE COUNTRY!

Wine growing is deeply rooted in <u>Franconia</u>, young winemakers, like <u>Thomas Schenk</u> bring fresh ideas into this old tradition.

Afternoon

Cellar and vineyard tour with wine tasting and food pairings at Schenk Winery.

Transfer from Randersacker to Würzburg (20 m*)

WELCOME TO WÜRZBURG!

Art, culture and Franconian wine are a way of life in Würzburg. It's an ancient episcopal seat and a vibrant university town with a baroque, distinctly southern feel and surrounded by beautiful vineyards.



Private tour of the city and visit to Würzburg Residence

The former residence of the prince bishops of Würzburg is one of the most important palaces in Europe and has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



Dinner at <u>Juliusspital Weinstuben</u>

Wine has a long history and centuries-old tradition at the Juliusspital winery. It is one of the largest Silvaner wine estates and second largest winery in Germany.

DAY 3

Morning Transfer from Würzburg to Bayreuth (2 h*)

WELCOME TO BAYREUTH!

Bayreuth, located about halfway between Munich and Berlin, is not only the home of Richard Wagner and the world-famous opera festival, but the city is especially important because it offers over 1,000 delicious local beers, brewed at more than 200 craft breweries in the region.



Walking tour of Bayreuth

A guided walking tour through the historic city center of Bayreuth.



Visit Margravial Opera House

The marvelous 18th-century Margravial Opera House is a UNESCO World Heritage site and has been called a "masterpiece of Baroque theatre architecture."

Afternoon Visit Richard Wagner Museum

Gain insight into the life of the musical icon. A permanent exhibition describes the life and works of Richard Wagner.

Evening Tour of Maisel's Beer Adventure World followed by dinner at Liebesbier

The Maisel Brewery and Cooperage Museum is listed in the Guinness Book of Records as the most extensive beer museum in the world.

Overnight in Bayreuth

DAY 4

Transfer from Bayreuth to Regensburg (2 h*)

Explore Regensburg, a picturesque city on the Danube River where history and culinary traditions come alive. Savor authentic flavors at Wurstkuchl, the world's oldest sausage kitchen, and enjoy a historic coffee experience at Café Prinzess, Germany's oldest coffeehouse. Immerse yourself in a city where every meal is a journey through time.



City walking tour of Regensburg

Experience Regensburg's charm on a city walking tour. Discover historic landmarks, quaint streets, and hidden gems in this beautiful Danube city.



Lunch at the Historic Sausage Kitchen

Savor history at the Historic Sausage Kitchen by the Stone Bridge, standing over 500 years. Relish homemade pork sausages, tangy sauerkraut, and Elsa Schricker's legendary mustard, all grilled over an open charcoal fire.

Afternoon

Visit Document Neupfarrplatz

Visit Regensburg's greatest archaeological excavations. The cross-section goes from the Roman officers' dwellings through the medieval Jewish quarter to an air-raid shelter from World War II.



Experience traditional German coffee and cake at Café Prinzess, Germany's oldest cafe.

Explore Thurn and Taxis Palace

The princess of Thurn and Taxis, founder of the first large-scale postal service in Europe (15th century), turned the former monastery into a magnificent castle-residence. The palace is said to have more rooms than Buckingham Palace in London.



Dinner at Dicker Mann

This inn dates back to the 14th century. Mediterranean-style courtyard and an open-air dining area under the historical arcades.

Transfer from Regensburg to Munich (2 h*)
