DAY 1

Morning Arrival at Munich Airport. Transfer to Regensburg (2 h*)

WELCOME TO REGENSBURG!

The city of <u>Regensburg</u> is situated beautifully on the banks of the Danube River. Founded by the Romans over 2,000 years ago, it is the best preserved medieval town in Germany. Regensburg's entire old town is inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage list. The Stone Bridge is an exceptional engineering achievement dating to the 12th century.



Guided Historic Walking Tour

Get acquainted with the Old Town, with its patrician towered houses, the cathedral, the Old Town Hall, the Stone Bridge and the Porta Praetoria.



Lunch at "Historic Sausage Kitchen"

Taste traditional and hand-made sausages from the oldest sausage kitchen in the world, right on the banks of the Danube River.



Leisure Time

Enjoy sightseeing highlights such as St. Peter's Cathedral, the Thurn and Taxis Palace, the Document Altes Rathaus, and the Perpetual Imperial Assembly Museum with Torture Chamber.

Visit the oldest inn in the world, Gasthaus Röhrl

Just outside of Regensburg (25 mins), meet Bavarian insider, Muk Röhrl, landlord of the inn. The Röhrl family has owned the inn since 1658. The Guinness Book of World Records has confirmed the family's long management.

DAY 2

Transfer from Regensburg to Nuremberg (1 h 30 m*)

WELCOME TO NUREMBERG!

In 1835 the first German railway was opened between <u>Nuremberg</u> and Fürth. Nuremberg is famous for the Imperial Castle, the Albrecht Dürer House, the German National Museum and the Documentation Center and of course the world-famous Christkindlesmarkt, Christmas Market.

Private guided tour through the Old Town and visit of the Imperial Castle

Imperial Castle is one of the most important imperial palaces dating from the Middle Ages: from 1050 to 1571 all the emperors of the Holy Roman Empire stayed here various times during their reign.



Private visit of the historic rock-cut beer cellars and Dinner at Hausbrauerei Altstadthof

Since its founding in 1984 at the historic site of the former Red Brewery in Bergstraße in the old town of Nuremberg, the Altstadthof Brewery has dedicated itself to brewing genuine Nuremberg beer specialties.

DAY 3

Transfer from Nuremberg to Würzburg (1 h 30 m*) Morning

WELCOME TO WÜRZBURG!

Würzburg has a special mix of culture and ambiance, world heritage and wine festivals, modern and classical music, avant-garde and age-old traditions. The stunning historical architecture provides the perfect setting!

Old town walking tour

Explore the historic town hall, the Romanesque cathedral "St. Kilian", the medieval fortress Marienberg and the old bridge "Alte Mainbrücke", where you can enjoy views of the famous vineyards.

Tour of Würzburg Residence Palace and Court Garden (UNESCO World Heritage Site)

Built as the permanent residence for the prince bishops of Würzburg, it is one of the most impressive Baroque castles in Europe, adorned by the largest ceiling fresco in the world.



Wine tasting and lunch at the Bürgerspital Weinhaus

Transfer from Würzburg to Aschaffenburg (1 h*)

Würzburg Residence: Designed by the then young and unknown architect Balthasar Neumann in the 1700s



WELCOME TO ASCHAFFENBURG!

Aschaffenburg is a historical, modern city located on the Main River. King Ludwig I of Bavaria loved the 1,000-year-old city because of its mild, almost Mediterranean climate.

DAY 4

Morning Visit Johannisburg Castle

The massive four-winged complex, built from 1605 to 1614 is one of the most important examples of palace architecture from the German Renaissance era.



Explore Schönbusch Park

Features an observation tower, the Red Bridge, the Temple of Friendship and the Philosopher's House, all arranged in charming settings with artificial lakes and "hills".

The Pompeiianum

Inspired by the excavations in Pompeii, King Ludwig I of Bavaria commissioned the building of an idealized Roman villa, which was completed from 1840 to 1848

Transfer from Aschaffenburg to Rothenburg ob der Tauber (2 h*)

- ☆ Walk on top of the city wall and along the Tower Trail
- "Snowball" pastry lesson at local Rothenburg bakery. The pastry dates back to the Middle Ages at Bäckerei Striffler.
