



TOP SIGHTSEEING HIGHLIGHTS

- **Stone Bridge** the oldest preserved bridge of its kind in Germany
- **St. Peter's Cathedral** the only example of French Gothic architecture in Bavaria
- Thurn and Taxis Palace in the middle of the 18th century the princess of Thurn and Taxis, founders of the first large-scale postal service in Europe (15th century), created a magnificent castle here
- Old Town Hall Imperial Assembly Museum
- Museum of Bavarian History
 permanent exhibition tracing
 Bavaria's path to becoming a Free
 State and what makes it so distinctive

- ★ May: Days of Old Music
- May & Aug./Sep.: Dult. Regensburg's mini-version of the Oktoberfest (twice a year)
- ★ Jun/Jul.: Bavarian Jazz Weekend in the Old Town
- July: Open Air Music Festival in the courtyard of the Thurn & Taxis
 Palace
- → Dec.: Five Christmas markets all over town including the worldfamous Romantic Christmas market at the Thurn and Taxis Palace



CITY'S HISTORY

- ★ Founded by the Romans 179 AD
- Known as Germany's best preserved medieval city
- ★ UNESCO World Heritage since 2006
- Nowadays, an economic booming and university city with a young life-style in old city walls

- **Walhalla** temple built by King Ludwig I to honor German heroes through the ages; it is a copy of the Panthenon in Athens
- O2 Boat trip from Kelheim –
 through the Danube Gorge to
 Weltenburg Abbey, the oldest
 monastery brewery in the world
- **Bavarian Forest** with crystal factories, National park and many museums
- "Liberation Hall" built by King Ludwig I in memory of the wars of Liberation fought by the Germany states against Napoleon
- O5 Crystal Museum Riedenburg
 with the largest cluster of rock
 crystal found in America and the
 biggest emerald crystal
