TOP SIGHTSEEING HIGHLIGHTS

- 01 **St. Stephen's Cathedral** – with world's largest cathedral pipe organ made up of 17,974 pipes, 233 registers and 8 chimes
- 02 **Conjunction point of the three rivers** – Danube, Inn and Ilz offer an impressive natural spectacle
- 03 **"Veste Oberhaus"** – Fortress & Museum
- 04 **"Kastell Boiotro"** – Roman Museum – part of UNESCO world heritage "Roman Danube Limes"
- 05 **Passau Glass Museum** – 15,000 pieces on display from time period 1650 to 1950



SEASONAL HIGHLIGHTS

- ★ **May to Oct.:** Cathedral pipe organ concerts
- ★ **Apr./May and Sep.:** **Passauer Dult** Folk Festival
- ★ **June:** **Oide Dult** Folk Festival
- ★ **July:** **Eulenspiegel Zeltfestival** – cabaret and music festival
- ★ **Nov./Dec.:** **Christmas Market** at the Cathedral



CITY'S HISTORY

- ★ **Circa 50 A.D.:** The first Roman settlements are founded
- ★ **From 739:** Episcopal seats and Prince Bishop's seat for the next 600 years
- ★ **1662:** Fire destroys city, and is rebuilt by Italian Baroque masters
- ★ **1803:** Passau becomes part of Bavaria



DID YOU KNOW THAT ...

- ★ ... in Passau, three rivers coming from three cardinal directions meet and continue flowing together in the fourth cardinal direction? The Danube comes from the west, the Ilz from the north, and the Inn from the south and they converge and flow together as the Bavarian Danube, traveling east to reach the Black Sea.
