TOP SIGHTSEEING HIGHLIGHTS

- 01 **Water Tower** Neu-Ulm: the city's landmark
- 02 **St. John the Baptist Church** – early example of modern sacred architecture
- 03 **Ulm Minster** – the highest church tower of the world (161.53m)
- 04 **Mr. Zopf's Hairdresser Museum** – the world's largest hairdressers' museum
- 05 **The Walther Collection** – from New York to Burlafingen (Neu-Ulm)

CITY'S HISTORY

- ★ **1811:** King Max I. Joseph decided to found a community
- ★ **1841:** Neu-Ulm became the bridgehead of the largest fortress in Europe
- ★ **1869:** town elevation of Neu-Ulm
- ★ **1900:** the water tower is completed
- ★ **2019:** 150 years of the city of Neu-Ulm



DID YOU KNOW THAT ...

- ★ ... you can visit the birthplace of Albert Einstein in Ulm only within a few minutes' walk from Neu-Ulm?



TOP DAY EXCURSIONS

- 01 **Fishermen's Quarter** – is the most significant part of the old city center of Ulm with old narrow streets, bridges and jetties. And it is also the place of the "most crooked hotel in the world".
- 02 **Lion Man** – the world star in the Museum Ulm actually @kunsthalle weishaupt
- 03 **Monastery Wiblingen** – the library is one of the most famous rococo buildings in Southern Germany.
- 04 **Federal Fortifications of Ulm/ Neu-Ulm** – largest fortifications complex in Germany (19th century)
- 05 **Blautopf Blaubeuren** – Magical appearance in bright blue and green. The Blautopf is a karst spring and the associated branched cave system has not yet been fully explored.
